We provide

- information and knowledge about the functional impairment and its consequences in daily life

- support based on situations that arise in relation to the functional impairment

The support is principally provided in group form.

We make contact with parents after a diagnosis has been made and the investigating unit has sent the neuropsychiatric study to the centre.

We offer:

- A welcome meeting for parents with a brief presentation of what the centre can offer.
- Introductory course for parents whose child has recently been diagnosed.
- A programme of relevant lectures and groups.
- Themed lectures regarding relevant subjects.
- Groups for parents, children/young people and relatives.
- Telephone advice, Wednesdays between 09.30–11.30.

18 years and older

You come into contact with us via a referral from a local habilitation centre.

We offer:

- Groups about the diagnosis.
- Various continuation groups, for example regarding communication, emotions and relationships.

- Lectures by individuals who have their own diagnosis.
- Lectures about Asperger's syndrome for your relatives.
